### Dear Chairwoman DeLauro and Ranking Member Granger:

Pursuant to the processes outlined by the U.S. House Committee on Appropriations and the U.S. House of Representatives, I am requesting funding for the historic "Upton Mansion" in fiscal year 2023. The entity to receive funding for this project is Afro Charities, located at 811 West Lanvale Street, Baltimore, MD 21217.

The proposed \$2,000,000 would be used to "support the renovation of the Historic Upton Mansion in Old West Baltimore to house AFRO American Newspapers' archive, its flagship offices, and the Afro Charities community outreach headquarters. The Upton Mansion has been vacant since 2006 despite its historical significance. This project would be a valuable use of taxpayer funds because it would activate the building and carriage house, and provide needed community engagement services, as well as jobs. The promise of this site's activation has allowed the Upton Planning Committee to attract a developer for eight vacant homes surrounding the site. AFRO American Newspapers will locate its flagship office in the mansion and has committed to a long-term lease which will bring up to 21 employees to the site, including the Afro Charities archive staff. This project will bring an annual economic impact of \$120,000 in spending to the area and will serve as a community anchor for media, African American archival history, and educational outreach. It will also serve as an international resource for over 4 million unique artifacts documenting African American life."
